Among other positions, we are in need of an Editor for this quarterly publication, the Gleanings. There are other already committed women who will help with the distribution and the e-mailing of the Gleanings, but we must have an Editor. If you, or someone you know, might be willing to serve in this capacity, PLEASE notify Jan immediately. Jan will call the individuals and make certain they know exactly what requirements and skills are required for this position. If no one steps forward we may not be able to put out our quarterly newsletter. We'll also be looking for a Convention Intern who will assist our Convention Chair next year and then assume the responsibility of Chair in 2012. Some of the open positions do not necessarily have to be Board positions. They have, for the most part been required Board positions in the past, but our more updated thinking leads us to believe they do not have to be.

The churchwide Women of the ELCA, Chicago, has announced that for the 2010-11 academic- year, 25 highly qualified women received a scholarship from their Scholarship and Grants program. Over \$31,000 total dollars were awarded and every region of our church has at least two recipients. In other pages of this issue you will read about the scholarship received by Stephanie Gordon of St. Stephen the Martyr Lutheran Church in Greendale. Congratulations, Stephanie.

Should your church unit have a Memorial/Resolution that they wish to put before the Delegates at our October Convention, please refer to the section in this issue on that subject. A Memorial/Resolution is a formal written proposal that asks for a specific action or position to be taken by the SWO that was adopted by your church unit at a duly called meeting. Further detail can be found on other pages in this issue.

Plans for next year's Triennial in Spokane, Washington are in full swing. Our Triennial Coordinator, Robin Fatla, has been forwarding information about the event to all those for whom she has e-mail addresses. Read more about the Triennial as you page through this newsletter.

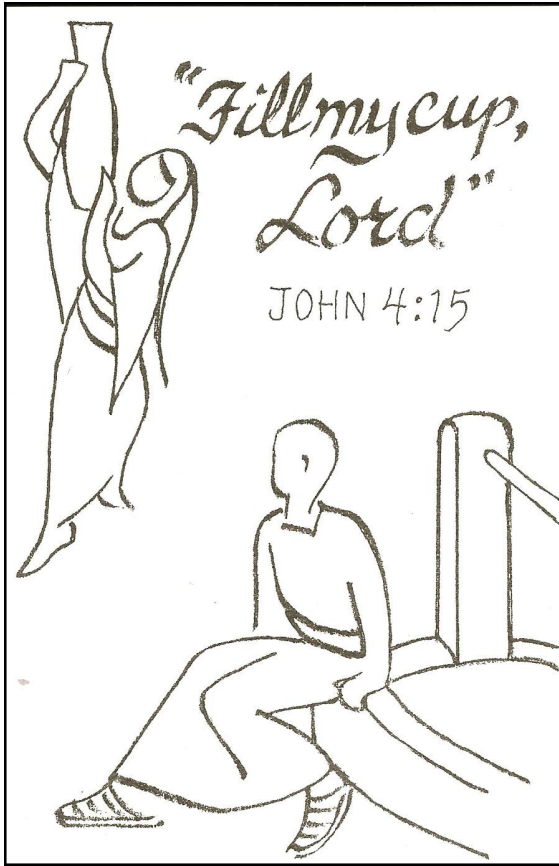

RESOLUTIONS

Among the benefits of participating in Women of the ELCA is the opportunity to have a voice in determining the activities and direction of the organization. Where we go and what we do as a churchwide organization and as synodical organization is very much up to you. A resolution should be thought of as:

- A way to participate in the democratic process and have your voice heard.
- A means of educating women about a particular need or concern.
- A vehicle for inspiring others to take a particular action.

Resolutions are your voice! At our 2010 Annual SWO Convention any delegate may offer a resolution from the floor, which is germane to any pending question. Basically, resolutions should be sent to Jan Camus at least seven (7) days prior to the Convention. Resolutions can also be presented by a Delegate to the Resolution Committee no later than 5:30 PM on Friday, October 1, 2010. The Committee then prepares recommendations for convention action on the resolutions it received. This committee will also help delegates with the proper wording of resolutions. Three copies are necessary: (1) one for the Secretary (2) one for the Resolutions Chair and (3) one for the person/Unit presenting the resolution to keep.

WHAT'S ON YOUR CELL PHONE?

A cell phone can be a useful tool for contact information should you need help, especially when away from home. I was hospitalized on a recent trip and was grateful I had programmed a variety of phone numbers into my phone before my trip.

Remember, if your cell phone is lost or stolen, others will have access to the information stored in it. Do not store personal information such as Social Security numbers, account numbers or passwords on your phone.



Suggested numbers to program into your cell phone:

- Physicians, Dentist
- Pharmacy
- Pastor/church
- Lawyer
- Insurance agents
- Hotel/lodging/transportation contacts
- Fellow travelers/trip leader/friends living in the area of travel
- Family members

Many people enter a contact labeled "I.C.E." which stands for "In Case of Emergency." Consider including ICE 1, ICE 2, etc. with the numbers for those to be contacted in case you are not able to speak with Emergency Responders.

Spend a little time learning how to use your phone and it can be valuable aid in a time of need.
